Chapter One--Understanding War

- 1. Define war. List and explain the two elements of this definition.
- 2. List examples of the physical, mental, and moral qualities of war.
- 3. Define fog and friction. List examples of each.
- 4. Explain the essence of methodical battle. List its characteristics.
- 5. Explain the essence of maneuver warfare. List its characteristics.
- 6. Explain how subordinate efforts are focused in a decentralized style of command.
- 7. List and briefly explain the three levels of war.
- 8. Define special operations. Give an example of a special operation.

Chapter Two--Development of Modern Tactics

- 1. List the three generations of infantry tactics in modern warfare. For each generation, identify the characteristics regarding:
 - a. weapons
 - b. tactical dispersion
 - c. method of attack
 - d. method of defense
 - e. basic maneuver unit.
- 2. Explain why technology and tactics are closely related, and give an example of their relationship.
- 3. Explain the effect that the rifled musket and breech-loading rifle had on close-order tactics.
- 4. Explain the German defense in depth doctrine of 1917. List the three defensive zones, the forces within each zone, and describe the functions of each force.
- 5. Describe the new assault tactics which the Rohr detachment developed in 1915.
- 6. List the qualities required in the modern infantryman.

Chapter Three--Tactical Fundamentals

- 1. Define and explain the commander's intent.
- 2. When placed in a tactical situation and given a mission order from your commander, write the mission order you would issue a subordinate commander.
- 3. Define the main effort.
- 4. Define surfaces and gaps. Give examples of each.
- 5. Explain what a fire sack is.
- 6. When placed in a tactical situation:
 - a. Explain how you might use combined arms.
 - b. Explain why a particular feature might be key terrain.
 - c. Choose an aiming point and explain why you chose it.
 - d. When given a concept of operations, explain the significance of the main effort.
- 7. Explain how different types of terrain affect different types of combat units (motorized, mechanized, or light infantry) with regard to mobility, security, and effects on firepower.

Chapter Four--Training and Education

- 1. Explain how you should run a map exercise.
- 2. Explain what free play training is and why it is valuable.
- 3. Explain the difference between technical and tactical training. Give examples of each.
- 4. Explain how you should lead a critique.
